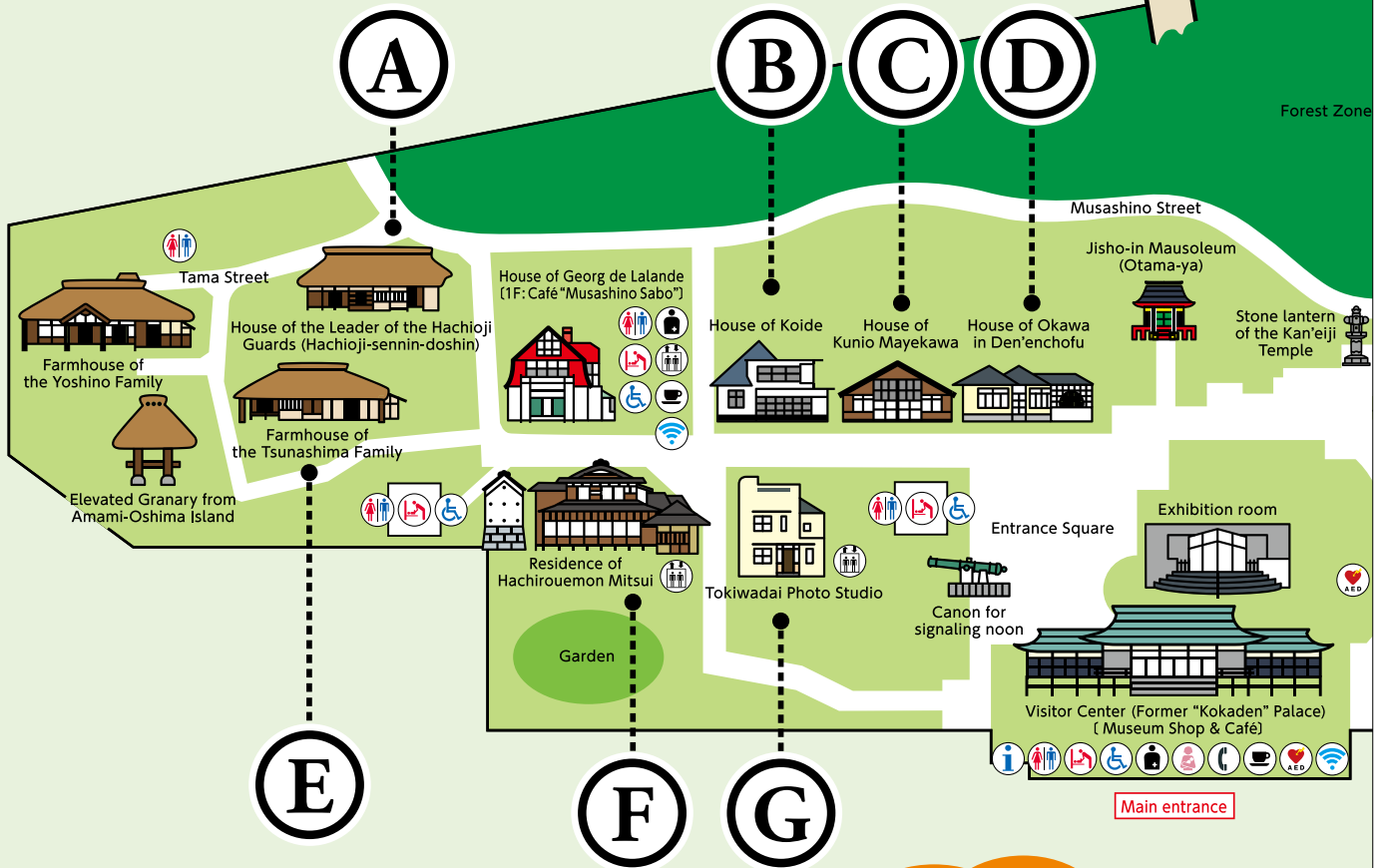

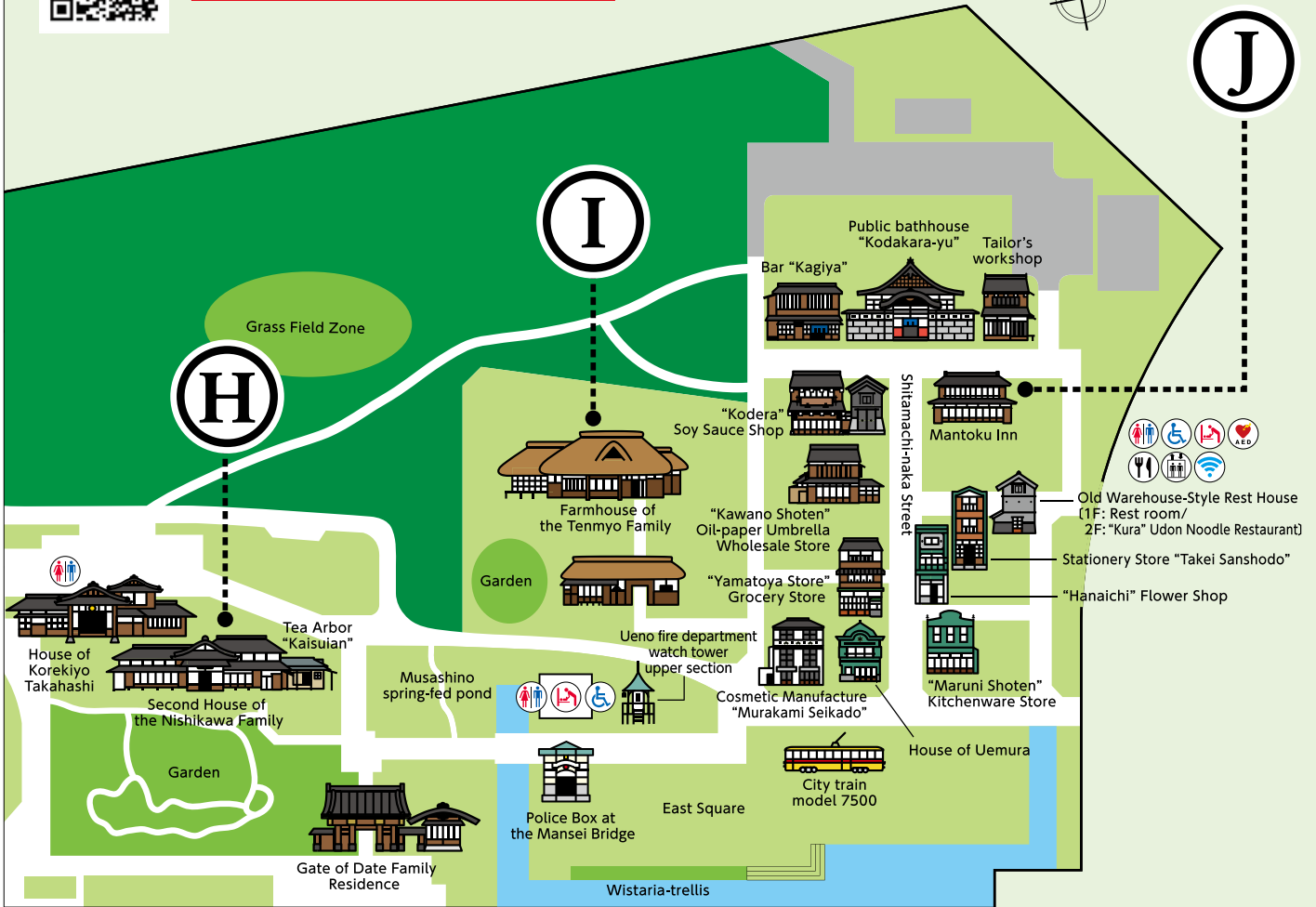

# Toilets

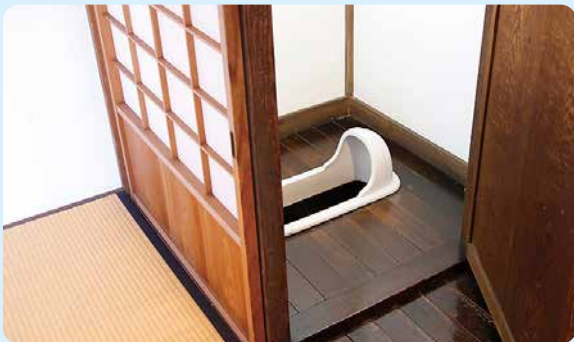
